The 1960s saw a steady improvement in their fortunes and, in 1986, they made it to their first World Cup final competition, making repeat appearances in 1998 and 2002. Denmark have graced the European championships no fewer than seven times. The climax came with championship glory in Sweden in 1992 and, ever since, Denmark have been known as “Danish dynamite”. The twelve clubs in the Danish league are a constant source of young players who make their mark in top clubs. The Laudrup brothers are only two of many famous names, not to mention legendary goalkeeper Schmeichel.

The first Goal project

The Danish football association has had its own headquarters since 2004 and received a Goal grant in February 2005 for remodelling purposes, which it has yet to put to use. In December 2006, the Goal Bureau gave the green light once again, this time for the construction of an artificial turf pitch directly adjacent to the headquarters, a multi-purpose administrative centre with seminar and meeting rooms at a central location. With these improvements, the Danish association is expecting to increase efficiency and, at the same time, reduce costs for the ultimate benefit of football in the country.



Second Goal project

The Danish football association project approved by the Goal Bureau on 22 October 2008 does not concern the association’s heartland, but the province of Greenland, which lacks many football facilities. A FIFA-standard Football Turf pitch will improve the situation and significantly extend the training season (three to five months per year). The new training pitch will be installed at the technical centre in Nuuk.
